## Board of Education Meeting Thursday, April 12, 2018

Mrs. Peabody led the Board and audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Lynch Principal Ryan West, along with teachers Tami Curry, Talia Leonard and Devon Weaver, presented information on Goal #1: *"100% of all K-5 reading and math units have KUDs aligned to CCSS as evidenced in lesson and unit plans. A companion document links curriculum materials to standards."* The presentation was specifically targeted to Benchmark 1.3.B which is *"100% of teachers will utilize collaboration to align unit instruction to standard KUD, demonstrate KUDs in lesson plans, sharing of learning target and lesson implementation and access grade level or department KUDs in public folders."* They presented details of what the teachers and other staff are doing to meet this goal.

Mrs. Byard reported on the Teaching, Learning and Technology Committee Meeting that took place on March 23, 2018. District Security Review, Mid-Year Board Goal Progress, TAG, Administrative Guideline 5410 – Promotion, Placement and Retention and Overnight/Out-of-State Trips were discussed at the meeting.
