## New Scheduling Opportunities

Counselors will begin working the schedule for the 2018-2019 school year after the holiday break. We start really early because this is such a complex process. Each year we make a few adjustments to course offerings we have for students in an attempt to offer as many exciting choices and opportunities as possible. For the 2018-19 school year, 7<sup>th</sup> grade students (current 6<sup>th</sup> grade) who are showing they are proficient in ELA will have the option of taking one of the following courses.

Introduction to Theater Arts  
Introduction to Literature Study

Introduction to Speech & Debate  
Introduction to Creative Writing

These courses will take the place of Literature 6 and Composition 7. As mentioned, students must be "proficient" in ELA to be able to take one of these required electives. This is shown by scoring above the 40<sup>th</sup> percentile on the Winter NWEA MAP test. All students who performed in the lowest 40<sup>th</sup> percentile in the Fall will be taking the test again in January. Students who improve their score and are above the 40<sup>th</sup> percentile can choose from the above courses. Those students who are still in the lowest 40<sup>th</sup> percentile or who have a demonstrated need for ELA support will be placed into Guided Academics for ELA. This course will supplement the regular 7<sup>th</sup> grade ELA class to allow more time and support to master concepts.

## Student Handbook Notes

Each month a couple areas of the student handbook will be highlighted. Don't forget the full student handbook can be found under the "Parents & Students" tab on our website at [rw.lapeerschools.org](http://rw.lapeerschools.org) This month's focus is on tardiness. Most students make every attempt to be in class on time. Sure, there is occasional long restroom break or other event that causes a tardy. That's why we are forgiving up to a certain point. At Rolland-Warner, we run an absence report once a month. Any student who has 5 or more tardies in a month will have to serve a 1-hour detention either in the morning or afterschool. Each month there is usually less than 10 students who have to serve a detention, but it tends to creep up a bit so we like to include a reminder in the newsletter.

### Tardiness (Page 49)

- 1) *Being up to 10 minutes late to class without a valid pass signed by authorized school personnel will result in a tardy. Appropriate disciplinary measures may be used by teachers in dealing with students late for class. Students are expected to be in the classroom before the tardy bell rings. Students arriving after the bell will be marked tardy. In addition, a cumulative tardiness record for all classes will be maintained by the administration.*
- 2) *Arriving late for school: Students arriving within the first ten (10) minutes of the school day should report directly to their 1st hour class and will be marked tardy. Students arriving more than ten (10) minutes late must report to the attendance/main office and will be marked absent to their first hour class. Oversleeping and mechanical difficulty to a privately-owned vehicle are not considered a valid excuse for being tardy or absent.*
- 3) *Missing more than ten (10) minutes of class, whether at the beginning or end of the hour, will result in an absence.*
- 4) *Students who demonstrate an unwillingness to conform to established tardy guidelines may be subjected to progressive school discipline. Exceptions to the discipline portion of this policy may be made if the student shows marked improvement in his/her tardy problem.*

On Wednesday, Jan. 10th (full day), Thursday, Jan. 11th (Early Release), and Friday, Jan 12th (early release), Rolland-Warner will be on the exam schedule for all secondary schools. While not every class is having exams, many are and a special schedule is required to make this happen. Since we share teachers with Zemmer and LHS, we need to be aligned with their schedule. Additionally, we have 0-Hour and PLTW to account for. In short, there are only so many solutions and none of them are perfect.

Therefore, on these three days all 0 Hour classes are cancelled. All Rolland-Warner students will start at the standard 9:24 start time. Students who normally ride the early busses in for 0-Hour/PLTW, will instead ride the regular Rolland-Warner Busses, or can be dropped off from 9 to 9:15, on those three days. Individual reminders will be sent home directly with students, a phone blast will be sent home as a reminder, and the transportation department will send letters to all 0-hour students letting them know when and where they will be picked up by the busses.

Any students who have a 0-Hour at Rolland-Warner will take their 0-Hour exams on the Monday and Tuesday of that week in their normal 0-Hour class. Year-round students will already have taken exams, but will still follow this schedule. The only difference is they will have a longer class period for certain hours on those days.

Please note that on the early release days, lunches will not be served to students. They will want to make sure to eat breakfast on that day. It sounds like a long time, but because of the late start our students usually don't eat breakfast until 9am. Students will ride their regular buses home on these days so be aware they will be arriving earlier than a normal day. Students should be picked up at 1:34 in the car rider loop as is normal, just at an earlier time.

Below, I have a tentative schedule that explains where students should be on what days. If any changes are made to this schedule before the exams it will be communicated. Hopefully this year we don't have any snow days during exam week like we did last year. That really threw a monkey wrench into everything!
