## Principal's Message:

## Exam Schedule

Before we get to the summer dates and say our goodbyes, we need to tie a bow around the 2017-2018 school year. Final exams do just that.

Rolland-Warner will be aligning with LHS and Zemmer for end of the year exams on June 13 (full day), June 14 (early release @1:34pm) and June 15 (early release @1:34pm). Because of this, **zero hour will be cancelled on these days** to accommodate a very difficult bus schedule. Zero-Hour Students who take the bus in will receive an updated bus schedule in the mail for these days.

## Student Handbook Notes

This was in last month's newsletter but it is extremely important for our 7<sup>th</sup> grade students to avoid any delay in starting classes. Please see the attached information on immunizations in this newsletter for specific information about where and when you can update student immunizations.

### ***provide an up to date immunization record...***

**For 7<sup>th</sup> grade students, immunizations are required for students to be completed before the first day of school.** This means that they need to be taken care of this summer. Students are not supposed to be in school without these immunizations completed. To avoid having students held out of class, please review this information and schedule appointments as soon as possible.

## Mark Your Calendars!

The new school year is just around the corner, especially for our Year-Round students. Please make a note of all the following important dates on your calendars to get the new school year off to a great start. A picture packet and a short summer newsletter will be mailed home the first week of August as well.

### July 24 — Rolland-Warner Office Opens

### July 26— 2-7pm, Year-Round Schedule Pickup

Any year-round 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, or 8<sup>th</sup> graders should show up at some time in this window to pick up schedules and get their lockers. For 7<sup>th</sup> grade students, this also might be a good time to hand in any updated immunization forms.

### July 31 — First Day of Year-Round School

For the month of August, our year-round students start the school day at a different time than they will when traditional calendar students return. **First hour starts at 8:39am until traditional calendar begins (at which point the start time changes to 9:24am).** The school opens to students at 8:30am.

### Aug 15 — Year-Round Student Picture Day

All year-round students will have their pictures taken between 10am and 12pm during the school day.

### Aug 15 — Noon-7pm – Traditional Schedule Pick-Up for Students in 6<sup>th</sup> Grade

All traditional students in 6<sup>th</sup> grade should stop in during the time window. While here, students will receive their schedules, locker information, transportation information, and have their school pictures taken. This allows us to have Student ID's more efficiently. Please make sure students are dressed appropriately.

### Aug 15 — 1:30-2:30pm AND 6-7pm – 6<sup>th</sup> Grade Optional Parent Meeting in Cafeteria

These meetings will be the same meeting (so only attend one). Basically, it will cover the student handbook, procedures (student drop-off, office procedures, etc.), and other practical information that you still may be wondering about. If you've had RW students here in the past, you probably don't need to attend. Mr. Stevens and Dr. Stanton will have a short presentation and then answer any remaining questions.

**Mandatory Athletic Meeting/Meet the Coach** on August 16<sup>th</sup> from 6-7pm.

Prior to the meeting, the following items are available in the office or online at <http://lapeerlightning.com> and **MUST** be turned in at the **Mandatory Athletic Meeting/Meet the Coach** OR prior to first practice/tryout:

- All athletes must have a completed **MHSAA Physical** (dated April 15, 2018 or after – must be new form or sign waiver when turning in)
- All athletes must have a completed **Emergency Card**
- All athletes must have a signed **Athletic Code of Conduct Card** (parent & student signatures required)

**\*Pay to Participate MUST be paid in full before any athlete may participate in a game/contest/meet.**

**\*Please see the Athletic Code of Conduct for information on 7<sup>th</sup> Grade Eligibility requirements (grades) needed last year and current.**

# Immunization Information

**Aug 16 — 12-7pm – Traditional Schedule Pick-Up for Students in 7<sup>th</sup> Grade**

All traditional students in 7<sup>th</sup> grade should stop in during the time window. While here, students will receive their schedules, locker information, transportation information, and have their school pictures taken. This allows us to have Student ID's more efficiently. Please make sure students are dressed appropriately.

**Aug 16 — 6-7pm – Fall Athletics/ Meet the Coach Night in Cafeteria**

All students that want to participate in Fall Athletics (Sideline Cheer, Girls' Basketball, Cross Country, or Football) and parents should attend the Mandatory Athletics Night to turn in the required forms, gain information on sports in general, and meet the coaches.

**Aug 21 — 3:30-4:30pm – Impact Testing**

Any student who is participating in 7<sup>th</sup> grade sports (Football, Girls Basketball, Sideline Cheer, & Cross Country) must take a mandatory concussion awareness test at this time. Sixth grade students do NOT need impact testing.

**Aug 22 to Aug 24 — No School for Year-Round Students (Teacher In-service Days)**

**Aug 27 — First day of school for Traditional Students**

The school opens at 9am for students to enter. Please do not drop students off before this time as there is no supervision for them. First hour begins at 9:24am. The school day ends at 4:05pm.

**Aug 29 — 5:30-7pm, Meet the Teacher Night**

Please arrive at 5:30pm for Zero Hour. Students can take you through a simulated day of their schedule. You can stop in each classroom for 10 minutes to meet the teacher with 3 minutes passing in between. Therefore, first hour would start at 5:43 and so on.

**Oct 26 – No School for All Students**

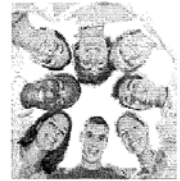


**Immunization Information**

Summer break is almost here. The last thing on a parent's mind is what vaccines your son/daughter will need before school starts next fall . . . but, keeping them up to date helps to protect them from diseases that can cause serious health problems. It also helps to protect other persons who may not be able to receive the vaccine because of health problems or medications they take (such as steroids and chemotherapy).

One example is Pertussis (also called Whooping Cough). In some healthy adults symptoms can be mistaken for a "bad cold." However, this disease kills many infants who are not immune. We have had increased cases of Pertussis in Michigan, as well as in many other states.

Measles is also an issue. It may sound like a cliché, but vaccine preventable diseases are truly only a plane ride away. Due to "imported" cases, there are multiple outbreaks across the country primarily in unvaccinated individuals.

**What is recommended?**

- \*Tdap/DTaP
- \*MMR
- \*Hepatitis A
- \*Polio
- \*Varicella
- \*Hepatitis B
- \*HPV
- \*Meningococcal

- \*Insured, but with no coverage for vaccines.
- \*Insurance: Call to see if we take yours.

**"Back to School":**

We give immunizations throughout the year, but clinics become **very** busy in August. Call early to ensure your child(ren) can get their needed vaccines **before** school starts. Your child(ren) can be excluded on the first day of class if their vaccines are not up to date.
