# 7<sup>th</sup> Grade Service Learning Students

I would like to take an opportunity to recognize all of the students who participated in 7<sup>th</sup> Grade Service Learning during the first semester. It was an inspiration for me to witness the hard work and dedication that students were willing to put into the class and into their individual projects. The general idea of the class was for students to identify needs in their community and then plan projects which could reach out to that area of need. Students went well above and beyond what was expected of them. On numerous occasions, we discussed the idea that if each of us can make just a small impact on the community we live in, then our impact as a whole group will be tremendous. Some of the organizations our students supported during the course were LACADA (Lapeer Area Citizens Against Domestic Abuse), Paradise Animal Rescue, the Salvation Army, and the Rolland Warner Outdoor Club. They raised money and resources by planning projects such as candy sales, a food drive, contests, and an art show. Students also sought to create a better atmosphere in the school by decorating lockers, doing custodial work, organizing classroom libraries, encouraging recycling, and handing out kindness cards to other students. ## **School Dance Policy**

To ensure the safety and security of our school dances, we have decided on some new policies regarding school dances at Rolland-Warner Middle School. Our next school dance is on Friday, February 7, 2014 and is sponsored by RWMS Student Council. Permission slips for this dance will be available in core classrooms and the main office beginning Friday, January 31<sup>st</sup>.

All students attending school-sponsored dances will be expected to adhere to the following:

- Dances are only for currently enrolled Rolland-Warner students.
- School dances are considered casual events; students should dress in appropriate school day clothing.
- Please do not send or drop off special clothing, shoes, or make-up for students to change into before the dance.
- Students will not be allowed to get ready in the restrooms before the dance. The Valentine's Dance begins at 3:55pm and students will be expected to be in the gym or café at that time.
- Students will be expected to be picked up promptly. The Valentines' Dance ends at 6:00pm. If students are not picked up promptly, they may lose the privilege to attend the next dance.
- Students not following these expectations during the dance may be asked to leave the dance early and are subject to policies found in the LCS Code of Conduct.
- Students who have had current behavioral situations may not be allowed to attend the dance. Administration will make decisions regarding these situations.
- Without a parent/guardian signed permission slip, a student will not be allowed to purchase a ticket.
- Tickets will not be sold on the day of the dance.

PLTW's comprehensive curriculum has been collaboratively designed by teachers, university educators, engineering and biomedical professionals, and school administrators to hone the real-world problem solving skills in students. PLTW courses will be delivered to students at the District's Center for Innovation - West Campus, starting in Fall 2014.

LCS will host two informational meetings in January to showcase this program and other academic offerings coming in 2014-15. Zemmer Middle School hosted the first on January 15. The second meeting will be at 6 p.m. on January 28 at Lapeer East High

"PTLW will give students more than just a glimpse into the future; it will help prepare them to not only compete, but thrive in the new economy," said LCS Superintendent Matt Wandrie. "The project-based model is proven to increase student engagement and achievement, so we're really excited to be able to offer this to our students moving forward."
