March is Reading Month!

Throughout the month of March, students at Rolland-Warner will be celebrating and promoting reading with a variety of activities. I-connect groups are in a fierce competition to read the most books by the end of the month. Students will also have the opportunity to design a bookmark to encourage their peers to read. Near the end of the month, there will be a books for wolf bucks sale and read-a-thon.

With students being busier than ever, it is sometimes difficult to squeeze in time for reading. However, as you can see in the chart below, reading at home for pleasure gives kids a huge advantage in school and in life.

If they start reading for 20 minutes per night in Kindergarten, by the end of 6th grade, Student A will have read for the equivalent of 60 school days, Student B will have read for 12 school days, and Student C will have read for 3.

WANT TO BE A BETTER READER? SIMPLY READ.

Having a role model at home is a great way to emphasize the importance of reading. At times, it may not seem like our kids are listening to what we say, but they are all the time watching what we do. Having a parent who talks about what they are reading or reads in front of his/her child can be just as powerful (if not more powerful) as having someone tell them it is important. Other students can also be "reading role models." I have noticed in my own classroom that if one student is excited about a book, his/her enthusiasm is contagious, and I will have several others begging for a copy of the book. Reading can connect people—the benefits are truly endless!
