Parking Lot

If you pick-up your child from school, you may have noticed a few changes lately. In order to ensure the safety of our students, parents, and staff, we have begun placing cones in the western entrances from the parking lot into the circle drive. This means that during pick-up time, approximately 4:00-4:20pm parents will no longer be able to drive from the parking lot and enter into the circle drive at the western end. This practice was creating an unsafe situation in which vehicles were pulling out in front of others.

You will still have the option to drive in and wait along the sidewalk or park in a parking space in the Demille Boulevard lot and have your child walk to your car. You will also notice that a staff member is outside in the parent pick-up area helping to direct and stop traffic so that children and adults can walk across safely.

It helps create a smoother end of the day if you talk to your child in advance to communicate where you will be waiting if at all possible (in vehicle circle drive or parked in parking lot). Please continue to be patient as we work to ensure the safety of everyone at the end of the school day.

 Members are responsible for maintaining NJHS standards of excellence in and around our school and community. They attend meetings; participate in various activities, and complete hours of community service throughout the year.
- Rolland-Warner Campus has a chapter for current 7th grade members who were inducted as 6th graders. NJHS bylaws require 6th graders to attend 1 semester before applying for membership. Applications will be given out in March to all 6th graders with a qualifying 3.5 GPA and satisfactory citizenship in all areas of school during the first semester.
- Current 7th graders, who meet the 3.5 GPA and citizenship qualifications listed above, will also be given an application if they are interested in membership in Zemmer's NJHS chapter for 8th and 9th grade next year.
- Being a member of the NJHS is a privilege for all students who meet the
