We would like to take this opportunity to thank our parents for their support throughout the school year.

We have many parents that help out behind the scenes by keeping up regular communication with the teachers and supporting their children at home. It takes all of you in this partnership between home and school to give our students the best opportunity for success.

We will be saying goodbye to our 7th grade students and wishing them well in their years at Zemmer 8/9 Campus, but we will be welcoming in all new 6th grade students in the fall.

End of Day Dismissal

In order to ensure safety and efficiency at the end of the day, we are releasing students in tiers according to their bus numbers and whether they are car riders or walkers. Students are being dismissed when their busses are here and the early busses are being released to leave RW at 4:10pm each day. Parents who are picking up students at the end of the day need to use the Demille Boulevard entrance ONLY. We are asking that parents do not use the Genesee Road parking lot to pick-up Rolland-Warner students at the end of the day because this causes too much traffic in a parking lot that is used for our early childhood programs and adds unsafe congestion to busses trying to leave the bus loop at that time of day. Students who are car riders are being directed to wait ONLY in the parent pick-up area in the Demille Boulevard lot.

Thank you so much for your help in keeping our dismissal process safe for everyone.

Schedule Pick-Up Dates

Balanced Calendar Students:

Common Summative Assessments & MAPS Testing



Our students will be participating in end of semester Common Summative Assessments for each of their classes during the final weeks of the school year. Each subject has 1-2 days to give the assessments during the regular class time. Students were given an organizer to write down each individual class assessment dates and other important info as the schedule is unique to the student depending on which classes he or she had. In addition, students will take the NWEA MAPS testing in math and reading during the last week of May and first week of June during math and ELA classes. This testing will show the progress they have made in these areas from fall to spring of this school year and is also used as a factor in determining placement in advanced courses as well as into intervention and support classes for next school year.

Awards Ceremonies

In the fall of this school year, we started a new tradition to recognize students earning academic awards. Instead of having our end of year awards ceremonies in the spring as we used to do, we held our ceremony in September.

This new tradition ensures that students are recognized for their entire school year achievements rather than just considering the first semester as we have done in the past.

If your child earns an award or honors recognition, you will receive an invitation in the mail in late August inviting you to this event. Students will be awarded for Outstanding Citizenship, academic achievement, honor roll, and various other accolades at this event.
