Back to School Shopping

When you are out shopping for back to school clothes this summer remember to check the school dress code policy. Staff members of Lapeer Community Schools strive to be aware of contemporary dress and grooming styles, but ask both students and parents to keep in mind that school is operated for the educational growth of youth in an atmosphere of dignity and seriousness of purpose.

- A. Students are expected to dress in a neat, clean, and modest manner that does not detract from the educational purposes of the school. Hats are not to be worn in the building.
- B. To maintain this standard, students are not to wear the following types of apparel:
 - 1. Spandex clothing and leotards
 - 2. Tube tops
 - 3. Halters
 - 4. Items which bare the child's back to the waistline or bare the midriff
 - 5. Mesh tops
 - 6. Tops that have plunging necklines and/or arm holes
 - 7. Clothing with obscene, offensive, or inappropriate statements and/or graphic designs
 - 8. Biking shorts
 - 9. Slashed or torn clothing
